Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
- Amirah: Greetings my fellow travellers, greetings.
- Group: Greetings.
- Amirah: Once again, I have the opportunity and pleasure of crossing the threshold and finding myself again with you here in this our temple now. And as has become the custom, I shall have the pleasure of a few words with you tonight. I note the illustrious ones are already

gathered about me, but I would like to express myself on behalf of the great effort that is being made by all ambassadors of good to break down the dark corners of human consciousness that there shall soon be a predominance of light.

It is very difficult for you to conceive the tremendous need for this impress at this particular and yet very crucial time in the evolvement of this civilization and I can say that because there has been five civilizations completed before this one in what you are now playing your part and it is very essential that this evolvement shall take on every spiritual aspect of growth until and not before so very long such thoughts will predominate in the human mind. We might all ask ourselves why this enlightenment has not come more quickly than it does come. The answer to this is that older generations of people emphasized more the more human emotions, things that bore upon life more delicately than they bear upon life to date. Life indeed has become increasingly sterile and consolidation, consolidated, and it is difficult to break down the many aspects of moralizing which in the root of things bear specifically on the integrity, righteousness and blessedness of life and living. From these things, the human races wondered and it does find difficult to look pleasantly into the light of truth. - Minnie Mackay: works. I, I, I tried very desperately in an age and time that was very difficult to express myself on these simple truths of which even Pasha has spoken tonight,

and it might possibly have been that in some circles I suffered quite a deal of condemnation. However, I did write so many stories trying to portray these deeper and intimate truths of our relationship.

- Woman: You understand these teachings when you was on this plane, did you?
- Minnie Mackay: Oh, yes, I do.

Minnie Mackay: Nothing at all. No, I did not.

Woman: Because in the war, if you remember, you wouldn't turn your clock back and you wouldn't meet anyone or near the – the certain time if the sender was going to be there. They had to be at the gate at a certain time. It was so rigid.

Minnie Mackay: Yes. In a true dedication of one's self -

- Minnie Mackay:- we aim to do everything that is possible in keeping with the understanding we come to and it did allow me to express myself more vividly on matters of truth. I think we are all entitled to that title. We are all sons of God. Sons and daughters of love, yes. Then while we may rightly bear that title emphasis was given on this particular name so that I might take my part and my place with those with whom I moved about with in those days which are so erroneously reported to you of that antiguity.

> I have a very pleasant feeling in being here with you tonight. I cannot interpret it, only in the sense that you at least with quite a few others are ready and willing to accept me. In this environment of your sanctuary, I am

not alone. I stand beside the most illustrious the thrice great and who is he? My teacher Hermes. Hermes Trismegistus which in your language means Hermes the thrice-great, the wise one, the Solomon of antiquity and way beyond the very dawn of your history he was. Being near him takes me far back in time. I can turn around the pages of time, walk down the corridors and find myself in the generous resplendency of the temples of antiquity. Those indeed were the days in which one most sincerely devoted himself, dedicated himself to the service of God. And it might yet be that our interpretation of God was something all together different than the interpretation that is given today. But I must admit that it is you also very generously today, isn't it? With any – without any sense whatsoever of the divine interpretation that could so easily be given to it that we might know God in all his many laws and in the better sense of our lives worship God.

Again let me say this has been a pleasure for me to be with you tonight. I who have been with your people, spoke with your people and loved with your people.
