Motion by Members of the Bar of the County of Renfrew to attend the funeral of Colin Scott Rankin, son of Colin Rankin (GA3-14)
[August 27, 1883]

At a meeting of Members of the Bar of the County of Renfrew, held in the Judge's Chambers, Pembroke, on Monday the 27th day of August, 1883 at 11 o'clock a.m. His Honor Judge Deacon in the Chair, the following Resolutions were adopted:

Moved by Thomas Deacon O.C. seconded by Henry Hamilton Loucks, that the Members of the Bar of this County, having learned with regret of the sudden and unexpected death of Colin Scott Rankin Esq, a member of the bar of Province of Ontario, and of late a practicing barrister at Winnipeg in the Province of Manitoba, do testify their respect for him as a member of their profession attending his funeral today in a body in their professional robes: Carried.

Moved by John [Hilletealf?], seconded by William B. White that at a meeting of the Bar of the County of Renfrew then present at the Town of Pembroke, held this 27th day of August 1883, the Members thereof hereby desire to express their individual and united respect for their late professional brother, Colin Scott Rankin Esq. barrister of the Osgood Hall, who died suddenly at Winnipeg Manitoba on the 27th day of August instant, and their great Sorrow at this sudden demise at the early age of twenty six years; and do also unitedly tender to Colin Rankin Esq. his sorely stricken father, and all his family, their heartfelt sympathy and condolence in their sad and grievous loss. Carried.
