My dear Mr Rankin: -

Your note of 21st inst Advising that the dispatches for Moose Fac--tory, forwarded from this office at the beginning of the year were put in the packet at Temiscamingue and arrived at that place on the 12th inst was received.

I am glad to know also that the statement of your account with the private cash has been received and is quite satisfactory.

Mr. Parson cabled me to England of your illness, and it was heard of with the greatest regret both by my colleagus [sic] of the Hudson's Bay Company and myself. It is however with much relief and satisfaction that I learned since my return here that you are improved in health and I sincerely trust that you may soon be restored to your accustom strength. Perhaps change of air for a few weeks to a milder climate would be of benefit to you, and if so we shall only be too glad to facilitate your views in this respect as far as we possibly can.
